Summer Preaching Rotation Includes Fisher/Bygland Parish in the Northern Lights Ministry Collaborative

Summer is a time for vacations, family reunions, weddings, and a few other weekend events. Pastors also take advantage of time off which often leads to pulpit supply needs. There being a limited number of pastors available for pulpit supply in our region, we at times struggle to fill the need.

Pastor Gregory Isaacson (Trinity), Pastor Mike Ozaki (First Presbyterian) and Pastor Gretchen Enoch (Fisher/Byland) have joined efforts to allow for a rotation of pastors in a preaching schedule that provides a few Sundays off for each pastor while also bringing a change of voice in pulpits. This also gives people some options for worship attendance. If you're at the lake, join us for an 11:00 am service at Trinity Point on Maple Lake south of Mentor, MN. Be sure to bring a few lawn chairs in case the weather allows us to do Beach Worship outside. If you're in Crookston, you can join us for a 9:00 am service at Trinity or sleep in a bit and worship at 10:45 am at First Presbyterian. Fisher/Bygland parish combine for one service at 9:00 am and alternate worship spaces each Sunday starting at Fisher Lutheran on May 26.


Rev. Michael Ozaki

Pastor Michael Ozaki is a shared pastor with Trinity Lutheran Church and First Presbyterian Church. He arrived in Crookston 3 years ago along with his Wife Brianna and four children Elle (10), Emery

(8), Miles (4) and Ezra (2). When he is not looking for new ways to love God's people and be church beyond our walls, you might find him spending time with family, riding a longboard, playing the drums or making things out of wood poorly but with high enthusiasm.

After high school Pastor Mike worked for 3+ years in mercy missions in India, Thailand, and South Africa focusing on HIV/AIDS affected children and families. He then returned to earn a Bachelors in Sociology from Eastern University while running a youth service experiences as part of Broad Street Ministry in Philadelphia. In 2012 he simultaneously attended Princeton Theological Seminary and Rutgers University to earn a Masters of Divinity and Masters of Social Work. Expecting to become a social worker with a passion for helping churches do better justice and care work, he felt an irresistible pull to ordained ministry instead.

Having ministered in RCA (Reformed Church of America), ELCA (Evangelical Lutheran Church in America) and PCUSA (Presbyterian Church USA) congregations across traditions, he is excited to see where the ever expanding and endlessly creative work of the Spirit will take us next, together.



COLLABORATIVE VISIONING



As you know, I think our future in rural ministry is to work collaboratively with other congregations so ministries might be shared. Ministry staff from all congregations can work as a team diminishing feelings of isolation and called to ministries that emphasize their strengths. Healthy congregational traditions can be shared and new possibilities for outreach can be considered. Here is what has been happening this year:

Congregational Discernment Retreat—On January 20, 2024, Trinity hosted a retreat that included St. Paul's Lutheran, Fisher/Bygland Lutheran, First Presbyterian, and Trinity. Leaders from these churches were guided through a process by the Nourishing Vocation Project that centered on the faith practice of VOCARE. VOCARE is an acronym which centered our discussions in these areas: Values, Openness, Call, Attentiveness, Regrets, and Experiencing God. We were encouraged to think about our futures and plan out next steps. We heard similar concerns and developed relationships that could consider future shared possibilities.

Shared Pastor—Trinity and First Presbyterian have been sharing a pastor for a few years. Pastor Ozaki continues in this call with an emphasis in youth ministry and adult education. He and Pastor Isaacson alternate preaching Sundays at both congregations. Growing from this ministry are a shared book study, handbells, and vocal choir. On occasion we share preaching series with both congregations.

Lay Visitation Program—Pastor Isaacson led training sessions with volunteers who will make regular visits to homebound members from both Trinity and First Presbyterian. Participants will bring communion and share a time of prayer to keep people connected with their church. This program is coordinated by Kathy Shultz and Barb Anderson.

Summer Pulpit Exchange—Summers can be difficult to find pulpit supply to fill vacations, continuing education, and sick leave. Fisher/Bygland share one service during the summer months which allow the possibility of rotating preaching assignments with Trinity and First Presbyterian. One pastor will preach at 9:00 am at Fisher/Bygland and then at 10:45 am at First Presbyterian. Another pastor will preach at 9:00 am at Trinity and then at 11:00 am at Trinity Point on Maple Lake. The third pastor will have a Sunday free from preaching.

Recovery Ministry—Pastor Enoch from Fisher/Bygland hosts a Bible Study using the 12-step process for people who are recovering with their own particular concerns. Entitled "Recovery for Everyday People" a group of twenty people gather on select Mondays in April and May at Trinity. People from around the area attend.

St. Paul Call Process—St. Paul's is in a search process for their next pastor. We do share on-call emergencies with them when a pastor is on vacation, out of town, or not available for short periods of time. St. Paul's does host a weekly Alcoholics Anonymous meeting that is open to the public.

It is important to note that not all pastors work well with a collaborative model. Also, not all congregations are a good fit for collaborative processes. In these initial steps we are working to develop trusting relationships where shared possibilities can be explored. When we come to the table together, healthy discussions can take place and a shared sense of mission and ministry can grow faith in new and life-giving ways.





The Sunday after Easter FPC had our annual meeting and potluck.

A little bit about me, I'm LOVE potlucks. Not just because I love food but because by it's very nature (people bringing what they have to share, adding it to other's gifts, appreciating and enjoying each without judgement and always to have more than enough). I think they are a beautiful extension of the communion table and Jesus' vision for his church.

And you all did NOT disappoint.

Which makes me think of the story of Jesus' the feeding of the 5000. Did you know it is the only story found in all 4 gospels (except for the resurrection)? So, we know it was central to how the early Jesus followers saw themselves and their mission. And if you were to read that story carefully, soon you see that its not really about Jesus power to make food multiply, it's about how God has already given us more than enough people if we are willing to connect and share it. Jesus' work that day wasn't to magically fix the problem, it was get the people to gather to face each other in mixed groups to see that God had already given them the solution. Instead of going off to fend for themselves in the markets, Jesus got someone to start sharing what they had. I would offer that what happened next was that as the plate got passed, those who had extra gave it and those who had need took it. Until what came back was a overwhelming 12 baskets.

We also know that the early church didn't do communion like us. Instead, each time they gathered to worship they would bring what they had, place it on the table, then after the worship everyone would sit, eat, and take what they needed for the week as they left. Every week was a miracle. Every week Jesus was lived out in that room. No wonder the Jesus movement couldn't be killed.

Over time that organic outpouring of radical generosity, abundance and equality got ritualized, spiritualized and systematized until it became the symbolic once a month act we take part intoday.

I and people like me spend a LOT of time thinking about how to make worship feel relevant and deep and impactful and what programs the church needs to grow spiritually and physically. We look high and low for the right words and ministry plans, swimming in a sea of "shoulds" and "comparisons" from all directions.

But what if all of that is really just a way of avoiding the simple call to return to a radical gathering of organic generosity and connection? Not with anonymous money in a private plate that is then dolled out by a committee to whom it deems worthy, but as an open invitation to come, gather, hear God's word and face God's people before giving and receiving as you have or need.

I have a feeling that if we could do that, praise and worship wouldn't take much effort. Fellowship and getting people to show up to church wouldn't require much planning. Seeking and discerning the Spirit wouldn't seem very mysterious.

Maybe we are just called to go where generosity and connection are already flowing and do what allows it to flow even more freely.

That's why I love potlucks. It feels like the church dipping its toes into God's ocean. My prayer is always that we learn and grow in the knowledge and conviction to swim and dive deeper into again.





Dear Applicant,

We are happy that you are thinking of attending a college of the ELCA and know that it will be a blessing to you, your family, and your career. To be eligible for a scholarship from the Northwestern Minnesota Synodical Women's Organization, you must meet the following criteria:

- 1. Be a graduating High School Senior with a "C" average or above.
- 2. Be a member of an ELCA Church.
- 3. Be a resident of the Northwestern Minnesota Synod of the ELCA.
- 4. Be attending an ELCA College.

Students receiving a tuition discount because their parent(s) are employed at an ELCA college would NOT be eligible.

It is the responsibility of the applicant to have the pastor and school administrator complete the form and return it to the applicant. The enclosed application, properly signed must be completed and postmarked no later than April 30 of each year. The Scholarship Committee will meet shortly thereafter to determine eligibility.

The scholarship is awarded to second semester college freshmen to be used for tuition or books. If sufficient funds are received from the local congregational units of the NW MN Women of the ELCA, \$250.00 per eligible applicant will be allocated. It will be matched by most of ELCA colleges that our students attend. The scholarship money is sent directly to the college. Students will be notified by the end of May of the scholarships awarded,
